## From Cube to Ball (Chapter 1,2,3)

The exhibition is inspired by the legacy of the Austrian modernist architect Ernst Plischke in New Zealand. The Walls We Build (As Thin As Paper) is a series of photo collages depicting the Massey House, the building designed by Ernst Plischke and Cedric Firth in Wellington. Each photograph has been re-arranged; the added patterns activate and introduce the new space in-between the viewer and the photograph. Funded by the NZ Meat and The NZ Diary Boards, The Massey House, built-in 1957, was the first modern skyscraper built in Wellington. Satin and Air Composition is a 1:1 floor plan of a typical apartment in Dixon Street Flats, Wellington designed by Gordon Wilson and Ernst Plischke in 1947. Satin's use has softened the hard-edge structure of the apartment floor plan, whereas the original concrete floor had been covered by (nothing but) the air.
